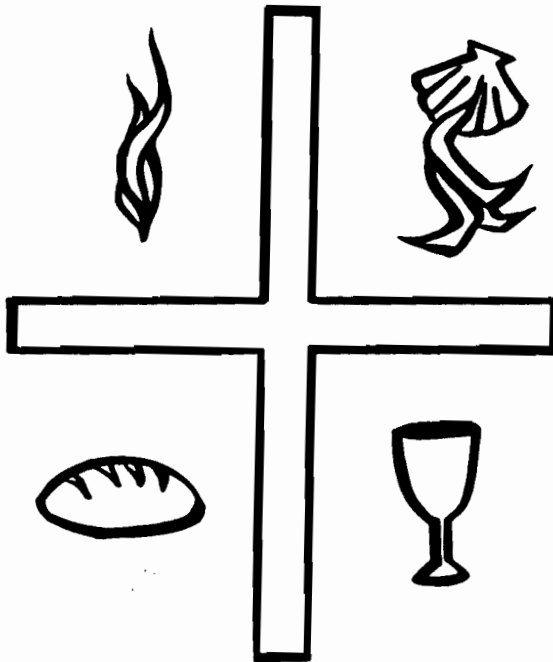

*The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!*

### **GOSPEL: John 17:6–19**

*In this reading the church hears Jesus' words on the night before his death. This gospel reports the words of Jesus' prayer, a prayer for his disciples and for all who would believe in him through their words.*

I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we

are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

Trusting in your abundant mercy, O God, we commend ourselves and all for whom we pray into your care, through Jesus Christ our Savior.

### **Pray for Joy Fulfilled**

In today's gospel, we see Jesus praying for those he is about to leave behind. This prayer of Jesus reminds us that we are sent out into the world. We have work, God's work, to do. Our task is to live an integrated life, one that lets the light of the good news shine through us and our actions. How do we do this? We follow the model of Jesus.

Maybe you've got neighbors who are at loggerheads—how can you be a peacemaker? Your grandma is lonely and far away? Write a letter once a week or send a card. You've got a friend who has hit a rough patch? Invite the friend over for dinner and share a bottle of wine or a pot of tea. You know that people are hurting in a tough economy? Make soup or provide support for your local shelter.

If these suggestions seem too time-intensive, use the actions of Jesus in today's gospel as your model. Pray. The beauty of prayer is that you can do it anywhere. In your car, pray for your family, your boss, the people you see at the gym, the parents of your children's friends, fellow church-goers, coworkers—all people who make up the fabric of your life. When you take a break during the day, remember to pray. As you watch or read the news, pray for all those victims in today's parade of traumas. As you drift to sleep at night, pray for God's protection for us all.

Each day, pray the prayer that Jesus prayed so long ago. "I speak these things," Jesus prayed, "so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves" (John 17:13). May that joy spill over onto others, as joy invariably does. Each day, ask God to guide you as you seek to be God's love made real in the world.
