RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD-COMMUNION

INTRODUCTION

In today's gospel Jesus reveals his power over death by raising Lazarus from the dead. The prophet Ezekiel prophesies God breathing new life into dry bones. To those in exile or living in the shadows of death, these stories proclaim God's promise of resurrection. In baptism we die with Christ that we might also be raised with him to new life. At the Easter Vigil we will welcome new sisters and brothers at the baptismal font, as we renew our baptismal promises

GREETING

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

P: The grace and peace of Jesus Christ, who was raised from the dead to bring everlasting hope, be with you all.

C: And also with you.

LITANY OF THANKSGIVING

P: Thank you, our Father, God, for the news of Easter;

C: We rejoice in the resurrection story, O God.

P: We are humbled by the magnificence of new life;

C: And we ask for continual renewal of life, O Father.

P: For the joy that sprang from the grave; for the happiness that Jesus' friends felt when He recognized them and called them by name and for the blessing of knowing him,

C: We give you thanks; O God.

P: Rekindle in us, this Easter, the faith you have so generously bestowed upon us through your Holy Spirit;

C: That our feelings, thoughts, words, and deeds may be directed by our trust in you, O Father.

P: Shower upon the whole earth, Magnificent God, the resurrection news:

C: That even where people do not know your Son, he may instill justice, at the very least, and merciful loving kindness, if possible, in the minds and hearts of all people.

P: At this season of the year, when the best news of all is proclaimed again and again, let it especially be heard by those who are sick;

C: By those who are troubled, in any way;

P: By those who are distressed in mind or spirit;

C: By those who are dying;

P: By those who are grieving for a loved one already called to triumphant life with you;

C: By all, O Father, who, in any way, need even stronger reassurance that yours is the victory over everything that can possibly destroy us.

P: Reassure them, and us that ours, too, is the same victory through Christ, whom we have accepted in faith.

ALL: Unto you, O God, Father, Son and Spirit, we give praise and honor now and forever. Amen.

GREETING

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God,
and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Let us pray.

O God, you gave your only Son to suffer death on the cross for our redemption, and by his glorious resurrection you delivered us from the power of death. Make us die every day to sin, that we may live with him forever in the joy of the resurrection, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

FIRST READING:

Colossians 3:1-4

Easter means new life for us as it first meant new life for Christ. His resurrection reshapes the entire focus and motivation for our lives, since we are now hidden with the risen Christ in God.

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

PSALM: Psalm 118:1–2, 14–24

Refrain: This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.
(Ps. 118:24)

Give thanks to the LORD, for the LORD is good; God's mercy endures forever.

Let Israel now declare, "God's mercy endures forever."

The LORD is my strength and my song, and has become my salvation.

Shouts of rejoicing and salvation echo in the tents of the righteous:

"The right hand of the LORD acts valiantly!

The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.

By the LORD has this been done; it is marvelous in our eyes.

GOSPEL:

John 20: 1-9

John's gospel describes the confusion and excitement of the first Easter: the stone is moved, disciples race back and forth, and angels speak to a weeping woman. Then, Jesus himself appears.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

O God, in the waters of baptism you call us by name and raise us to new life in you. Renew us with all faith, hope, and love, that we might be Christ's risen body in the world. Hear us, O God.
Your mercy is great.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

O God, we give thanks for the saints whose lives proclaim the victory of your love. With them, give us courage to follow our crucified and risen Lord, until all things are gathered in his name. Hear us, O God.
Your mercy is great.

Into your hands, O God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy; through Jesus Christ, our crucified and risen Savior.
Amen.
